# GRADUATION QUALIFYING EXAMS – ISTEP

- **SOPHOMORES TAKE PART ONE IN FEBRUARY / MARCH**
- **SOPHOMORES TAKE PART TWO IN APRIL / MAY**
- **MUST PASS ISTEP TO GRADUATE**
- **CUT SCORE FOR MATH: 271**
- **CUT SCORE FOR ENGLISH: 244**
- **IF BELOW CUT SCORE, MUST RETAKE JUNIOR AND/OR SENIOR YEAR**



# RETAKE THE GQE

- **JUNIORS RETEST IN NOVEMBER / DECEMBER**
- **IF ISTEP IS NOT PASSED BY END OF JUNIOR YEAR.... MUST ATTEND SUMMER SCHOOL 2020 FOR REMEDIATION**
- **DURING SENIOR YEAR, RETAKE ISTEP.**
- **IF ISTEP IS NOT PASSED BY END OF SENIOR YEAR.... MUST QUALIFY FOR WAIVER OR GRADUATION PATHWAY**

# DIPLOMA TYPES

- **CORE-40 DIPLOMA—40 CREDITS NEEDED TO GRADUATE FROM MARTINSVILLE HIGH SCHOOL**
- **ACADEMIC HONORS DIPLOMA—47 CREDITS NEEDED TO GRADUATE FROM MARTINSVILLE HIGH SCHOOL**
- **TECHNICAL HONORS DIPLOMA—47 CREDITS NEEDED TO GRADUATE FROM MARTINSVILLE HIGH SCHOOL**

Course and Credit Requirements	
<b>English/ Language Arts</b>	<b>8 credits</b> Including a balance of literature, composition and speech.
<b>Mathematics</b>	<b>6 credits (in grades 9-12)</b> 2 credits: Algebra I 2 credits: Geometry 2 credits: Algebra II <small>Or complete Integrated Math I, II, and III for 6 credits. Students must take a math or quantitative reasoning course each year in high school</small>
<b>Science</b>	<b>6 credits</b> 2 credits: Biology I 2 credits: Chemistry I or Physics I or Integrated Chemistry-Physics 2 credits: any Core 40 science course
<b>Social Studies</b>	<b>6 credits</b> 2 credits: U.S. History 1 credit: U.S. Government 1 credit: Economics 2 credits: World History/Civilization or Geography/History of the World
<b>Directed Electives</b>	<b>5 credits</b> World Languages Fine Arts Career and Technical Education
<b>Physical Education</b>	<b>2 credits</b>
<b>Health and Wellness</b>	<b>1 credit</b>
<b>Electives*</b>	<b>6 credits</b> <small>(College and Career Pathway courses recommended)</small>
<b>40 Total State Credits Required</b>	

Schools may have additional local graduation requirements that apply to all students

\* Specifies the number of electives required by the state. High school schedules provide time for many more electives during the high school years. All students are strongly encouraged to complete a College and Career Pathway (selecting electives in a deliberate manner) to take full advantage of career and college exploration and preparation opportunities.

**CORE40 with Academic Honors** (minimum 47 credits)

For the **Core 40 with Academic Honors** diploma, students must:

- Complete all requirements for Core 40.
- Earn 2 additional Core 40 math credits.
- Earn 6-8 Core 40 world language credits (6 credits in one language or 4 credits each in two languages).
- Earn 2 Core 40 fine arts credits.
- Earn a grade of a "C" or better in courses that will count toward the diploma.
- Have a grade point average of a "B" or better.
- Complete one of the following:
  - A. Earn 4 credits in 2 or more AP courses and take corresponding AP exams
  - B. Earn 6 verifiable transcribed college credits in dual credit courses from priority course list
  - C. Earn two of the following:
    1. A minimum of 3 verifiable transcribed college credits from the priority course list,
    2. 2 credits in AP courses and corresponding AP exams,
    3. 2 credits in IB standard level courses and corresponding IB exams.
  - D. Earn a combined score of 1750 or higher on the SAT critical reading, mathematics and writing sections and a minimum score of 530 on each
  - E. Earn an ACT composite score of 26 or higher and complete written section
  - F. Earn 4 credits in IB courses and take corresponding IB exams.

**CORE40 with Technical Honors** (minimum 47 credits)

For the **Core 40 with Technical Honors** diploma, students must:

- Complete all requirements for Core 40.
- Earn 6 credits in the college and career preparation courses in a state-approved College & Career Pathway and one of the following:
  1. Pathway designated industry-based certification or credential, or
  2. Pathway dual credits from the lists of priority courses resulting in 6 transcribed college credits
- Earn a grade of "C" or better in courses that will count toward the diploma.
- Have a grade point average of a "B" or better.
- Complete one of the following,
  - A. Any one of the options (A - F) of the Core 40 with Academic Honors
  - B. Earn the following scores or higher on WorkKeys; Reading for Information – Level 6, Applied Mathematics – Level 6, and Locating Information-Level 5.
  - C. Earn the following minimum score(s) on Accuplacer: Writing 80, Reading 90, Math 75.
  - D. Earn the following minimum score(s) on Compass; Algebra 66 , Writing 70, Reading 80.

# PSAT

## Taken in October

Taken by top 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> graders

Purpose:

- 1) Prepare students for the SAT
  - 1) SAT required for four-year colleges
- 2) Qualify for the NMSQT
  - 1) Scholarship Money

# SAT/ACT

- Not required for two-year, military, trade schools
- ACT = [actstudent.org](http://actstudent.org)
- SAT = [collegeboard.com](http://collegeboard.com)
- Free/Reduced Lunch, JAG, 21st Century Scholars students see your counselor for a fee waiver (2 maximum per test)
- Use four free score recipients
  - Especially for IUB, PURDUE, NCAA
- If scores low, retake and resend

# COMPARISON

- Differences at a Glance:

## SAT

- no science section
- math formulas provided
- reading, relevant words
- reasoning test
- no guessing penalty
- subject scores are 200-800
- total score is 1600
- questions from easy to hard

## ACT

- science reasoning section
- no formulas provided
- grammar & usage
- content-based test
- no guessing penalty
- subject scores are 1-36
- total composite score is 36
- easy and hard questions mixed
